
Each year, **Merit Health** and other local organizations support United Way of South Mississippi by running a workplace giving campaign.



ENHANCE TUTORING PROGRAM

KL (2nd grade) was an early reader needing help with vocabulary and comprehension skills to advance. Since beginning tutoring she has learned to dissect stories. She can now point out main topics and key details. She has also become more fluent. We are so proud of her successes!

ENHANCE TUTORING PROGRAM

This student (1st grade) was not very motivated to learn and disliked reading. After attending tutoring, he has become very motivated and involved in reading instruction. He is encouraging to the other children about learning and listening when the teacher is trying to teach. Before tutoring, he was not very excited to be at school. His mother told me that now he is very excited about coming to school. He is now ready and willing to try anything I ask of him. I believe the extra time I have had with him in tutoring has really made a difference in his attitude toward school and learning.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS

JB is an six-year-old member who has faced many Academic and personal obstacles in his young life. Although Jude has grown socially, academically he has had challenges. This school year Jude struggled to maintain a mid to average grade in reading and did not have much confidence in his reading abilities. Since attending Boys & Girls Clubs of the Gulf Coast, Forest heights, Jude has participated in tutoring services, including the Stride program and KidzLit. Staff has witnessed his reading skills sharpen, his love for reading develop, and his ability to communicate improve. To ensure that he retained as much as possible during the school year he participates in KidzLit activities. His participation in Stride and KidzLit proved to be beneficial for his academic support. Jude scored well on his first term progress report and we anticipate that he will continue to do well. He enjoys the curriculum and looks forward to his time in Stride. We have paired our Stride programming with KidzLit and He is working on improving her reading comprehension skills. With programs like Stride and the assistance of caring adult professionals, Jude has the opportunity to believe, achieve and excel academically just like his peers.

In 2019, **\$409,000** saved on prescription medication with FamilyWize prescription saving card in South Mississippi!




VITA/TCE sites still submitted nearly 2.4 million returns nationwide. That's 2.4 million individuals and families who received free, quality tax return preparation.
